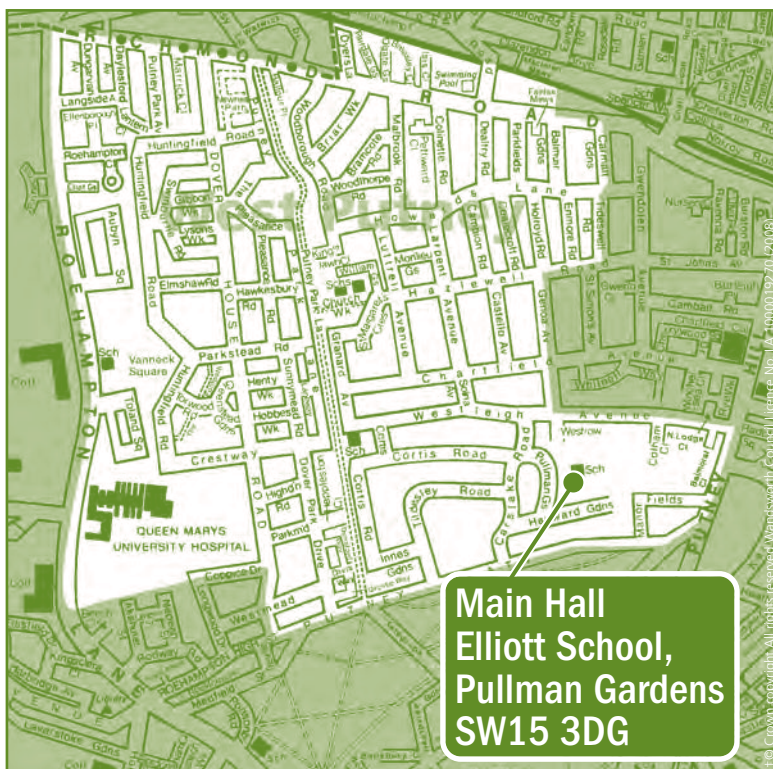
The council wants to know what you think about life in West Putney ward.

Around the Ward

Anti-social behaviour Councillors have worked closely with the Safer Neighbourhood team to combat vandalism on the Ashburton estate. A "Chelsea Football in the Community" initiative operates in co-operation with the council out of the Ashburton Youth Club.

Dryburgh Leisure Centre The council's extensive refurbishment of Putney Leisure Centre and Dryburgh Hall is now complete. The swimming pool was repainted, and the centre now offers an air conditioned gym, precision cycling studio, new dance studio, cafeteria and crèche.

New Zebra Crossing A new crossing at Putney Heath at the bus stop near the junction with Dover House Road, has made the road here safer, particularly for elderly residents. A similar proposal at the north end of Dover House Road is now being developed.

Rat-running Over the last 18 months, the council has been working with Transport for London (TfL) towards introducing effective measures to prevent rat-running through West Putney, particularly down the Dover House Road and Carslake Road.

Putney Park Lane Following the establishment of the Wandsworth Community Justice Court, the Community Payback project will be repainting the railings down Putney Park Lane. Repairs are being carried out ahead of painting.

Dangerous dogs The council's dog control officers collaborated successfully with the Safer Neighbourhood team in identifying and prosecuting the owner of the two dogs which killed another, smaller dog in Putney Park Lane.

Dover House Estate The council is working with the local residents' association to prevent the extensive use of the road by vehicles, particularly during the morning and evening rush hours, and to consult over the siting of a future children's playground. A cold calling zone was set up to cover part of the estate leading to a reduction in the number of unwanted doorstep callers.

Bus stand on Putney Heath The council consulted with local residents and the Putney Society to ensure that the improvements made by TfL to the bus stand opposite the Green Man would not disturb the neighbourhood and that suitable landscaping and planting was provided in the surrounding area.

*3 year average figures are used to even out annual fluctuations. No allowance has been made for either pupils with special educational needs or those with English as an additional language.

**Each pupil's value-added score is based on comparing their Key Stage 2 performance with the median - or middle - performance of other pupils with the same or similar results at Key Stage 1.

The individual scores are averaged for the school, to give a score that is represented as a number based around 100. This indicates the value the school has added on average for their pupils. Figures above 100 show that pupils have made more progress than expected, based on their previous attainment, and scores less than 100 show that pupils have made less progress than expected.
