This is your chance to quiz councillors on the services you receive and to express your views on the key local issues.

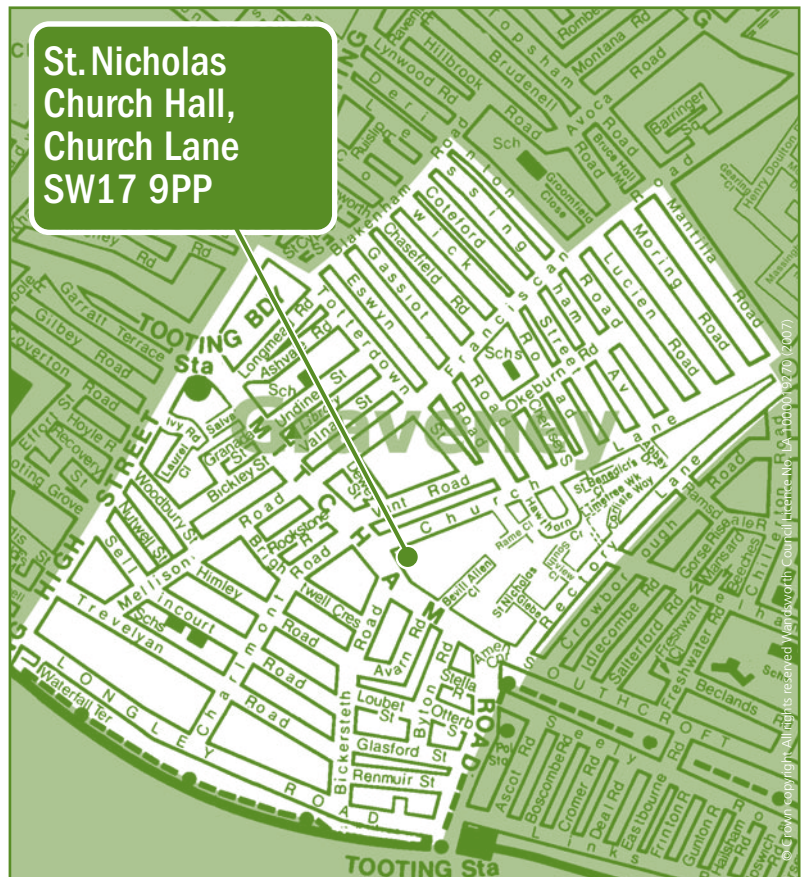

Around the Ward

Planning Councillors have been working with local people on plans to redevelop the old Mercedes site and the group of shops next to Sainsbury's - both in the High Street. We have been trying to get the best outcome for local needs.

Rubbish and Fly-tipping Councillors are working with Wandsworth Council's big new initiative aimed at cleaning up the Totterdown Estate.

Sellincourt School Centenary We offer Sellincourt School our warmest congratulations on its centenary and look forward to the forthcoming celebrations.

Traffic There have been specific measures to make traffic improvements in and around Renmuir Street.

St. Benedict's Rat-Running Local Councillors have been working with local police and residents to stop the pizza deliverers, and others, from using the St. Benedict's Estate as a rat-run between Church Lane and Rectory Lane.

Anti-Social Behaviour The Community Safety Team and Graveney's Safer Neighbourhood Team of police officers are working closely together to reduce problem behaviour by young people across the whole ward but at the moment especially in Franciscan Road.

Tooting Library The plans to expand and refurbish Tooting Library on its present Mitcham Road site have been promoted and warmly welcomed by all.

Wandsworth Green Plaque Scheme As part of the Borough's new green plaque scheme to commemorate local history sites there are plans for three locations in Graveney to get plaques over the next few years.

*3 year average figures are used to even out annual fluctuations. No allowance has been made for either pupils with special educational needs or those with English as an additional language.

**Each pupil's value-added score is based on comparing their Key Stage 2 performance with the median - or middle - performance of other pupils with the same or similar results at Key Stage 1. The individual scores are averaged for the school, to give a score that is represented as a number based around 100. This indicates the value the school has added on average for their pupils. Figures above 100 show that pupils have made more progress than expected, based on their previous attainment, and scores less than 100 show that pupils have made less progress than expected.
