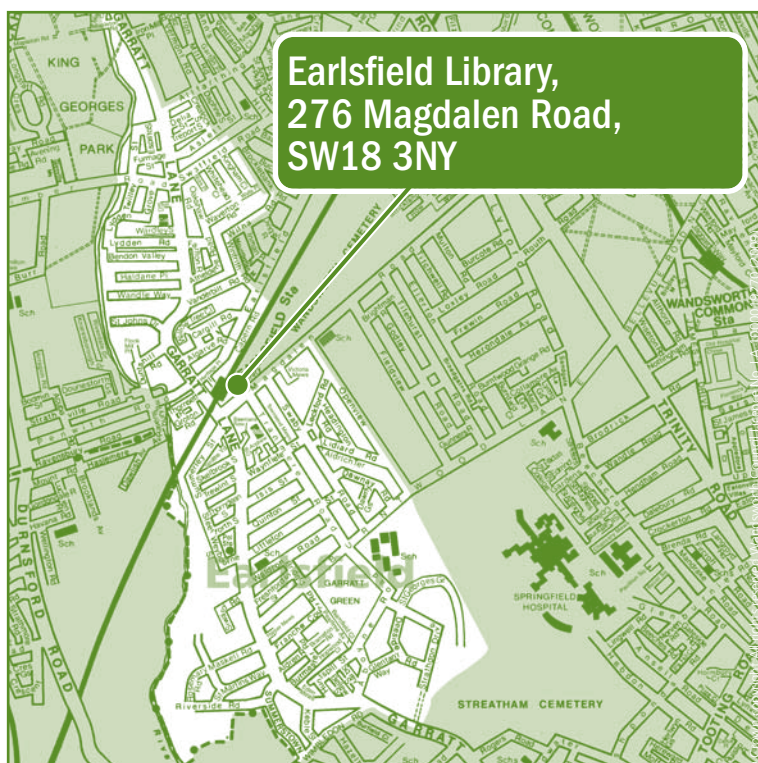
The council wants to know what you think about life in Earlsfield ward.

Around the Ward

Sherwood Lodge Talks are under way on a new use for the former Sherwood Lodge care home in Atheldene Road. The building could provide accommodation for key workers such as teachers and NHS staff while its long term future is considered.

Burntwood Lane speed cushions Following meetings with residents and councillors, new road lay-outs have been developed. These aim to meet local concerns. Councillors will be working with residents to find a solution to the traffic issues in Burntwood Lane.

Garratt Lane loading restrictions Councillors successfully campaigned for the removal of peak-hour loading restrictions on Saturdays in a section of Garratt Lane south of Magdalen Road. The change has helped local shops and businesses.

Aboyne Estate Authorisation for a new parking zone on the estate is expected soon. This follows a local consultation with residents which has been supported by councillors as a means of making parking easier for Aboyne residents.

Springfield Hospital plans The South West London and St George's NHS Trust failed to win planning permission for new homes and mental health facilities on the Springfield Hospital

site. The council's planning committee said the development would be out of character with existing properties in the area.

493 bus to Wimbledon Councillors campaigned successfully for the 493 bus to be extended from Wimbledon Station to St George's Hospital via Plough Lane. This is a particular help to people who cannot manage the stairs at Earlsfield Station.

Kickz project Chelsea FC and the council are working together on the Henry Prince Estate to get boys and girls aged 12-18 involved in football. The Kickz project offers first class training for young people and helps them to grow in confidence.

Earlsfield Station Network Rail has told the council it hopes to have a new, improved concourse and lifts in place by the end of 2010. Councillors have been lobbying hard for investment at the station which is one of the most heavily-used in the borough.

*3 year average figures are used to even out annual fluctuations. No allowance has been made for either pupils with special educational needs or those with English as an additional language.

**Each pupil's value-added score is based on comparing their Key Stage 2 performance with the median - or middle - performance of other pupils with the same or similar results at Key Stage 1. The individual scores are averaged for the school, to give a score that is represented as a number based around 100. This indicates the value the school has added on average for their pupils. Figures above 100 show that pupils have made more progress than expected, based on their previous attainment, and scores less than 100 show that pupils have made less progress than expected.
