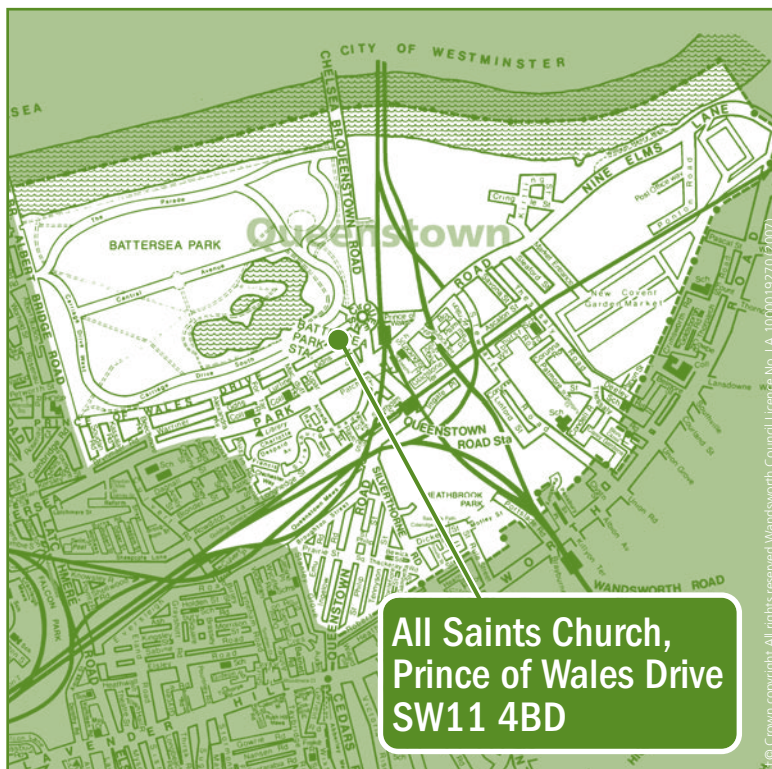
The council wants to know what you think about life in Queenstown ward.

Around the Ward

Additional buses Councillors have welcomed the additional services on the 344 bus route. These were desperately needed to cope with demand in the morning rush hour.

Savona residents association People living on the Savona Estate have been working with the council on plans to re-form their residents association. This will give the community a stronger voice on local issues.

Anti-social behaviour The council and local police have been working with Montefiore Street residents to tackle anti-social behaviour by young people in the area. Solving this problem is the key to getting the park here refurbished.

Estate enhancement Improvements to the public areas on the Rollo Estate have been agreed with residents. These include new flower boxes at the block entrance and painting of the entrance lobby floors to Rawson Court.

Battersea Park playground In Battersea Park we are hoping to see a programme of improvements to the children's playground later this year.

Austin Road Following action by local councillors a parking area in Austin Road which was being used for car repairs has been secured. The land here is now up for sale which will hopefully lead to a permanent solution.

Support for new garden Councillors have been supporting the Friends of Battersea Park on the creation of the new winter garden at Sun Gate.

*3 year average figures are used to even out annual fluctuations. No allowance has been made for either pupils with special educational needs or those with English as an additional language.

**Each pupil's value-added score is based on comparing their Key Stage 2 performance with the median - or middle - performance of other pupils with the same or similar results at Key Stage 1.

The individual scores are averaged for the school, to give a score that is represented as a number based around 100. This indicates the value the school has added on average for their pupils.

Figures above 100 show that pupils have made more progress than expected, based on their previous attainment, and scores less than 100 show that pupils have made less progress than expected.
