

At the recent Balham Report Back Meeting on Monday, 19th May 2008 a range of issues were discussed, including:

- Measures to improve traffic problems experienced by residents using the Smugglers Way Civic Amenity Site at the weekends.
- Arrangements for the collection of garden waste
- Confirmation that the Council would not be participating in the charging pilot
- Monitoring to ensure that litter is not left in the street following refuse collection rounds
- Measures to improve the Hildreth Street farmers market
- Improvements to the town centre
- Curtailing numbers of estate agents in the town centre
- Request to improve frontage of Majestic Wine on Balham Hill
- Measures to prevent and slow down rat running on various roads in the Ward
- Traffic management around the Tesco store in Clapham South
- Replacement of “No Lorries” sign on Malwood Road
- Thanks for introducing traffic calming on the corner of Temperley Road and Blanfield Road and a request for better enforcement of one-ways working on Temperley Road
- Enforcement on “Not suitable for heavy vehicles” sign on Badminton Road
- Concern relating to loss of car parking spaces on Cavendish Road
- Repair of potholes
- Concerns regarding dangerous dogs in the area
- Update on Tooting Triangle
- The current position on Ivor Mayor Lodge in Thurleigh Road
- Concerns were raised regarding the poor conversion of some properties
- Apparent planning consent breaches were reported in relation to a wall on Temperley Road and some flats on Catheles Road
