Registering to vote

You can only vote if your name is on the register of electors. We update the register every autumn. However, you do not have to wait until then, as we can add, delete and amend names throughout the year.

Moved Home? Coming up to 18? Just not on the Register?

All you have to do is fill in a voter registration form. You have to sign your form, someone else cannot do it for you. Documentary proof of residence may be required.

When you return the form we will add your name to our list of new applicants. Any elector can then object to your name being added to the register. If this happens we will write to you.

If no objection is received we will change your details on the dates as shown below. We will write to you when your application is allowed.

An objection can still be received after your name has been added to the register. If this happens we will write to you.

Registration can take place up to 11 working days before polling day. For the Mayor of London and Greater London Assembly Elections being held on Thursday 3 May 2012, applications can be received up to Wednesday 18 April 2012 and your details will be changed on Thursday 26 April 2012. We will also tell the Electoral Registration Officer for your previous address that you have moved, so that your name can be removed from that register. People who live at two homes (including students) are allowed to register in respect of both addresses. People may only be included on the register for an address at which they live i.e. owning but not living in the property does not qualify.

The electoral registration officer must compile two versions of the register.

The edited register can be sold to anybody and used for any purpose. You can choose not to appear on this register by ticking the relevant box overleaf.

The full register lists everyone who is entitled to vote including those who have chosen not to appear on the edited register. Only certain people and organisations can have copies of the full register, and they can use it only for electoral purposes, the prevention and detection of crime and checking your identity when you have applied for credit. It is a criminal offence for them to pass this information on to anyone else or to use it for any other purpose.
