### **Putney CPZ, A6 sub-zone – Gressenhall Road (between Melrose Road and Granville Road), SW18 - Parking Review Consultation Results**

You may recall that the Council carried out a consultation in November 2010 to ask for your views on whether the parking controls in your area are working effectively including options to amend the operational hour. This letter is to inform you of the results of the review, which were presented to the Strategic Planning and Transportation Overview and Scrutiny Committee at its meeting on 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2011.

The overall response rate (37%) was satisfactory.

The majority of respondents 18 (72%), said they were not happy with the parking controls. Of these, 15 (83%), said that the parking problems occurred outside the hour of control.

The majority of respondents 19 (76%) said they wanted longer hours of control. 6 (24%) wanted to retain the same one-hour control. There was no support for the controls to be removed.

Based on the above, the Executive agreed that the Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) should be amended to operate from 9.30am to 4.30pm, Monday to Friday in Gressenhall Road (between Melrose Road and Granville Road) as a result of this review, following support for a proposal to that effect from the committee. This will bring it into line with the hours of control in Melrose Road and the upper section of Gressenhall Road (between Melrose Road and Cromer Villas Road).

You will not need to change your resident permit as it is the same as one for a road in which controls operate all day. Visitors will either need to display an all-day visitor permit, which are recommended for longer stays, or purchase a pay and display ticket from a machine, which will be installed in your section of the road, if staying for a shorter time.

**These changes are programmed to be implemented no earlier than 9<sup>th</sup> May 2011. We will let you know the precise date later in a further letter.**

It is not possible to introduce the changes any sooner as we must carry out a statutory consultation with the emergency services, amend and advertise the Traffic Management Order, and install new signs and a pay and display machine before the controls can be changed. This takes several weeks to arrange. A location for the pay and display machine will be selected that is away from property frontages, where it will have the least visual impact.

As you are aware, the price of resident visitor permits in a zone with all-day controls is different to the price of resident visitor permits in a one-hour zone. Consequently, you will be required to pay the all-day zone price for visitor permits from the commencement date of the new all-day control. Visitor permits in all-day zones are currently £5.50 each for residents under 60 years of age, or £2.75 each for residents over 60 and disabled badge holders.

Although resident visitor permits are not normally exchangeable or refundable, we will exchange up to a maximum of 5 unused one-hour resident visitor permits per household from residents of Gressenhall Road for all-day visitor permits. Any Gressenhall Road resident wishing to exchange their permits should send them to the contact name and address in the heading of this letter within one month of all-day controls coming into operation. Please note that one-hour zone visitor permits are not valid in streets where all-day controls apply.
