1. Advice Services in Wandsworth

The advice services in Wandsworth provide an extensive range of support to local residents. Wandsworth Council funds the Wandsworth Citizen Advice Bureaux (WCABx) to provide generalist advice on many varied issues to residents of Wandsworth.

WCABx plays a pivotal role in empowering people to face their problems, whether this is through a high level of support or providing the tools and skills to go it alone.

Debt is a major concern facing some Wandsworth residents and many have never completed a simple budget sheet or been brave enough to take on their creditors. This means that the creditors keep the upper hand and some use undue pressure to bully people into settling debts that they cannot afford. The amount of debt we each have needs to be controlled and embraced, it happens to nearly everyone at some point in their life.

WCABx are second to none in helping people to come to terms with the benefits system. With more than 40 different benefits and varying payment levels for each, even the simplest application for benefit can be a minefield. WCABx provides basic information to vulnerable members of the community. For example, did you know that a 60-year-old pensioner with less than £8,000 in savings is entitled to at least £119.05 per week from state and other pensions, topped up with Pension Credit. This Pension Credit then entitles the same person the full Housing Benefit and Council Tax Benefit and, if they are a home owner, help with housing costs like service charges.

The benefits system is changing so if you are wondering about your benefits or entitlements to tax credits, pop into your local Citizens Advice or if you have access to the internet, try a website like www.entitledto.co.uk and just enter in your details and check what you should get.

Apart from people with benefit problems, and debts which are ruining their lives, WCABx give advice on many other topics. Another popular source of client misery is consumer law where people have failed to read the contract to purchase goods and services before they sign. Mobile phone and broadband are high on the list of trouble makers, closely followed by the numerous utility companies. Please remember the following:

- If you already have a contract with a company, they may cold call you and use the fact you are a customer to sign you to a new product if you agree verbally over the phone. A contract does not have to be in writing.
- Your signature is your bond. Never sign without reading the full contract and ask for anything you do not understand to be explained, re-written and added to the contract before you sign.
- If you sign up for a service for 12 months or 18 months, you have signed up for a service for this length of time. If you cancel the agreement you will face compensating the company for any expenses they incur which could range from a cancellation fee to the bill for the whole contract. The law is on their side.
- Never cancel a contract if you can find a situation where the supplier is in breach. This means that if they have failed to provide something or sent out shoddy goods, they are breaking the Sale of Goods and Services Act and in breach of the law. The contract will be very difficult for the supplier to enforce.

The Citizens Advice Bureau Service works to fulfil two aims. To ensure that individuals do not suffer through lack of knowledge of their rights and responsibilities or of the services available to them, or through an inability to express their needs effectively. Equally, Citizens Advice

Bureau exercises an influence on the development of social policies, both locally and nationally to bring about reforms in law and society as a whole.

The advice given by the Bureaux is free, independent, impartial and confidential.

Wandsworth Citizens Advice Bureaux

Wandsworth Citizens Advice Bureaux deal with over 10,000 enquiries each year. These are from residents in Wandsworth who come from all walks of life. They aim to provide a confidential support service that helps clients to resolve their problems and worries, whether it is through intervention with third parties or by providing advice and assistance where necessary.

The following case studies show some of the ways in which Citizens Advice can help you. Mrs X attended a bureau on an initial advice session. She had been in an abusive relationship for several years and had come to the point where she could not face going back to her abuser. The bureau acted with other local agencies to provide her and her children with accommodation. They organised for her to have support and someone to talk to and they sorted out her benefits and organised for her to get interim payments whilst the paperwork was being dealt with. We have had no further direct contact with Mrs X, but are told that her and her children are doing well.

Mrs Y was heavily in debt. She did something stupid at work to try to get money and this backfired and left her with no job and no reference. She turned up at a bureau £20,000 in debt and very upset. The advisor contacted the client's employer to try to get her job back but the nature of the offence meant that this was not going to happen. The employer had used the disciplinary procedures correctly and there was no breach in process. The advisor negotiated with the employer and the latter admitted that Miss Y had been a conscientious employee. It was agreed that the employer would provide a reference detailing her strong points and not release the reason for her dismissal unless he was forced to do so.

The bureau then helped Miss Y with her debts. They helped her to prioritise which needed to be paid as emergencies, i.e. rent and utilities and which could be offered token payments whilst she was unemployed. They helped her to apply for benefits and appealed the sanction given against her Job Seeker's Allowance.

Miss Y is now handling her debts and on low repayments with her credit cards and unsecured loan. She has completed a college course and is looking to start her own business.

TOP TIP from Wandsworth Citizens Advice Bureaux

Employment Law

Many people experience disputes, bullying or unfair treatment at some time during their working lives. In 2004, formal procedures for addressing employees' concerns were introduced and they apply to most employment-related disputes. All employers must comply with these procedures and provide their employees with written information about the procedure.

If your concerns are not addressed by raising them informally with your manager, you may wish to raise a formal grievance. You can use a grievance procedure to complain about certain aspects of your working life which are unfair. The procedure can be used if you are aggrieved about an action which your employer has taken or is threatening to take. In some circumstances, you must raise a formal grievance before you can complain to an employment tribunal.

If you have been dismissed from your employment, make sure that you have received your statutory notice or contractual notice pay, if longer, together with any other payments due to you such as commission, bonus holiday pay etc. If you are dismissed because you are found to have committed an act of gross misconduct, you will not be entitled to notice pay. Nevertheless, you should still receive a payment in lieu of any untaken holiday together with any other contractual payments owed to you.

If your employer dismisses you for gross misconduct, and you feel this is unjustified you may have been wrongfully and/or unfairly dismissed. In these circumstances you may be able to complain to an employment tribunal. Remember that the time-limit for doing so is 3 months from the effective date of termination. We recommend that you seek specific legal advice from a solicitor specialising in employment law before taking any steps.

TOP TIP from Wandsworth Citizens Advice Bureaux

Private Renting and the New Tenancy Deposit Scheme

For people renting property from private landlords, these are people with a short hold assured tenancy; there is a scheme that was introduced in April 2007 that protects your deposit. The Tenancy Deposit Scheme has been set up to ensure that where people are entitled to get a full refund of their deposit, this actually happens. It also aims to reduce disputes between landlords, agents and tenants.

At the beginning of your tenancy, you still pay a deposit but this is then put into a deposit scheme and you will be provided with the details of this scheme within 14 days. If your landlord or agent has not put your deposit in a scheme you can apply to the County Court who will force them to do so or to refund the deposit to you.

Remember to go through the inventory with your landlord or agent when you first move in and take photographs of any damaged items. At the end of the tenancy check through the inventory with your landlord or agent and take photographs of the state in which the property is left. Allow for fair wear and tear and check that you have paid rent up to date and other expenses i.e. bills etc that are not included. Then agree with the landlord or agent how much of the deposit should be returned. i.e. the full deposit if no damage or outstanding bills.

The agreed amount should be received by you within 10 days of this agreement.

TOP TIP from Wandsworth Citizens Advice Bureaux

Immigration

The most common enquiry related to immigration that we get at the Wandsworth Bureaux is "how can I become a British Citizen?" There are two ways. The first is if you are the spouse or civil partner of a British citizen. The second way is to apply in your own right.

As the spouse or civil partner of a British citizen you must be settled in the UK and have lived here for at least three years. You must not have breached any immigration laws. You must be of good character and have sufficient knowledge of language and life in the UK. You must also be able to understand the nature of the application. i.e. be of full mental capacity.

To become a British citizen in your own right, you must have been free from any time limit on your stay during the 12 months immediately prior to making your application i.e. you have held indefinite leave to remain for more than a year etc. You must have been living in the UK for at least 5 years and not have breached any immigration rules during this time. You must be of good character and have sufficient knowledge of language and life in the UK. You must be of full mental capacity and intend to make your principle home in the UK.

According to the Home office being of good character includes "showing respect for the rights and freedoms of the UK, observing its laws and fulfilling one's duties and obligations as a resident."

The knowledge of language and life in the UK can be satisfied by taking a test called "Life in the UK" if you hold ESOL level 3 or above, or if you have not achieved ESOL Entry level 3 you will need to attend and pass the English language and citizenship classes held at several of the colleges in the borough.

Once you satisfy the above, fill in the application form AN available from the Home Office. Please check your application carefully before you send it, as the Home Office rarely refund the full cost of an application when the applicant has made mistakes.

At the time of going to press an application for Naturalisation is £655.00 for an adult and £400.00 for a child.

Creditors and Harassment

Creditors do harass people who owe them money. Many people expect it so they don't report harassment and it goes unchallenged. Section 40 of the Administration of Justice Act 1970 makes it an offence for a creditor to harass you by attempting to coerce payments from you in a way which alarms, humiliates or distresses either you or your family, due to their frequency, publicity or manner.

Whilst it is not illegal to have a creditor telephone you asking for payment if indeed you do owe them a debt, it is harassment if they misrepresent themselves, or the matter in hand. For example if they misinform you that they are a court official, or that non payment of the debt will be a criminal offence.

Harassment is illegal. You should report harassment to The Trading Standards Office. Their website is www.tradingstandards.gov.uk (see Page 22)

Creditors often contract out to 3rd party debt collectors, with commission incentives of up to 30% for collection. This incentive may lead some unscrupulous collectors to call and threaten all sorts of action and penalties to obtain payment. The good news is that the Office of Fair Trading (OFT) (see Page 22) states that creditors who employ external debt collectors must take responsibility for their conduct. So if making a report you should refer the person who phoned you and your creditor to The Trading Standards.

When an external debt collector calls you they need to keep within the 2003 debt collector guidelines from the OFT, whose telephone number is 08457 22 44 99 and website is www.oft.gov.uk. When they call they have to make clear who they are; who they work for; what their role is and the purpose of their contact. If they don't provide this information, when asked, you do not need to talk to them as they are breaking the OFT guidelines. If they continue to call and you are a BT customer, then you can get the callers number blocked. However, it is important to remember that if you do have a debt that you are not dealing with, that you obtain advice on what options are available for you. The Citizens Advice Bureau can provide guidance and their details can be found in this directory.

Not sure whether your creditor is a real creditor? If you think they are a loan shark call Consumer Credit Licensing on (020) 7211 8608 and find out.

Debt

The recent credit crunch and increase in fuel prices have left a lot of people in financial difficulties. More of us are seeking help with our finances and there are many options out there. So which is right for you?

Individual Voluntary Agreement or IVA's are agreements between yourself and your creditors. They allow for your necessary expenditure and they offer what is left to be split between your creditors. They run for a total of five years and when they finish, your debts that were included are cleared. However, they are legal agreements if you don't make any of the agreed payments in the 5 years your creditors could demand the full amounts back immediately or take you to court. It is important to consider the terms of the Agreement carefully. In theory they can write off up to 75% of your debt but in practice this is more likely to be around 30%. However, this does not mean that it is an easy way out of taking on too much debt. Always consider whether you will be in a position to pay back the credit if you take it out. Don't think

about an IVA unless you are in stable employment as you need to make sure you meet the full amount due, every month, on time. Check out companies prior to setting up an IVA as many make large charges for this service. We suggest that you try organisations who charge no initial fee, like PayPlan 0800 716 239.

Bankruptcy is a court process in which you declare that you cannot meet your debts. It can write off a percentage or sometimes all of your debts and can be an option if you are not working or on low income, are not a home owner and have no assets of real value. However, if you own your own home, have a professional qualification, a highly paid job or other source of good income like a well paid pension, bankruptcy should not be your first avenue explored. It is also important to note that a person's bankruptcy needs to be declared in certain situations and will be on your credit record, affecting your credit rating and future ability to take on further credit (which includes mobile phone contracts) for some time. The Bankruptcy Advice Centre offers free advice to anyone who is contemplating bankruptcy 08712 500 300. Their website is www.bankruptcyadvicecentre.co.uk

Another option is to try negotiating with your creditors. Before you contact them (see Appendix for Example Debt Letter) you should look at your finances. This means drawing up a budget sheet (see Appendix for Example Budget Sheet) which shows what money you have coming in and what expenses you have going out. Once all of your necessary costs have been met, the money left over can be offered to your creditors. You need to make sure that you pay priority debts first. These are things like fuel bills, social fund debts, mortgage and rents arrears etc. Then once you have made arrangements with these creditors, any money left over can be paid towards your non-priority debts. Credit cards, unsecured personal loans and catalogue debts are all non-priority. Should you find yourself in a situation where your outgoings are exceeding your incomings then you may want to contact someone like the Consumer Credit Counselling Service, who are a charity that advise in relation to debt and they can help negotiation situations with your creditors to enable you to pay only what you realistically can afford. You can contact them on 0800 138 1111.

If you feel like tackling your creditors, "Dealing with your Debts" by the Money Advice Trust is a useful leaflet that gives an example budget sheet and templates for letters you can write. You can get a copy by calling 0808 808 4000 or pop in to your local Citizens Advice Bureau and pick one up.

Debt is overwhelming but please don't bury your head in the sand. Lots of people are in incredibly high level debt but they have used these methods to gain control over their finances. As a general rule, you need to contact your creditors so that you take control of the situation rather than them being in charge. They are usually more willing to help if you contact them and explain the situation rather than ignoring them. It is the first step to dealing with your debts and taking control of your own matters.

Utilities

The current trend of increasing prices has caused a lot of people to get into arrears with their fuel bills. One major concern is where people have had estimated bills and these have been based on summer consumption levels, their actual usage is a lot higher than that they have been billed for. Estimated readings will have an 'e' next to the reading. Check this 'e' figure against your meter reading to see if your latest bill is too high or too low.

Most utility companies are members of the Energy Trust and they offer financial assistance for people who have got into short-term difficulties with the energy bills. If you are on benefits or in receipt of a low income it is worth checking whether your provider is registered with this scheme. Contact Charis Grants who run the scheme 01733 421 021 and they will be able to tell you. EDF and British Gas are both members and applications to their Energy Trust are made using their application form that can be downloaded or sent to you if you contact the application request line 01733 421
