Street upgrades There is welcome news that parts of Wimbledon Park Road, Replingham Road and Augustus Road are to be improved and that concerns about poor quality paving and the look and feel of the area around the tube station are to be addressed. If you come across any broken or defective paving or have ideas for improvements please let us know.

New shops and homes A scheme to replace the rundown shopping parade in Beaumont Road with smart new retail units with flats above has now been approved. This will provide residents with a number of small neighbourhood shops plus a larger supermarket-style outlet. The council is working to reach a compensation agreement with the existing businesses and hopes to start work on the new development next autumn.

A simple change In response to a 300-name petition, a yellow line has been added to the Augustus Road end of Beaumont Road which has made traffic movement much easier.

One way system redesign Work is continuing on Transport for London's plans to revamp the Wandsworth one-way system. The changes will make large areas of the town centre more pedestrian-friendly and could deter some of the 'rat running' that affects this part of the borough. Ward councillors will be keeping a close eye on developments to ensure local residents and businesses feel the benefit.

Community cash The council currently has a pot of nearly £500,000 for community projects that improve the borough. If you have good ideas to make West Hill ward an even better place to live and work please get in touch with your local councillors.

Planning update The rebuilding of Ronald Ross School to include the addition of new accommodation for Greenmead Special School on the Beaumont Road/ Castlecombe Drive site is now underway. And work is also expected to start soon on the new housing development at the former St John Bosco site in Princes Way.
