Your ward councillor report

Roehampton Regeneration As we move towards selecting a development partner for the Roehampton Regeneration, we are working with the council to ensure that the detailed plans meet the needs of all affected Roehampton residents and businesses.

Medfield Street, Ponsonby Road and Treville Street We are again consulting with residents about a Controlled Parking Zone as it is sometimes impossible for residents to park. We have held one meeting and will be petitioning the council shortly.

Roehampton Outdoor Arts Movement (ROAM) We believe that ROAM will be an important part of the social regeneration of Roehampton. All those of you who went to the Christmas Lantern celebrations and the visit to Roehampton by 'Steggi' the stegosaurus will know just what an impact ROAM can generate.

Roehampton Safer Neighbourhood Panel We have kept an active presence at the Safer Neighbourhood Panel supporting the

local police team and community representatives. We have tried to make sure their work is 'joined up' with Neighbourhood Watch, and with the agencies helping local people with domestic violence problems and others with drug and alcohol issues.

Alton Activity Centre Your Roehampton Councillors have been campaigning with local parents to ensure a good range of services continue operating for children and parents at the Alton Activity Centre. We are pressing for more activities and full-time opening in the autumn.

Putney Vale Together with local residents, we are making progress in persuading Transport for London to improve the pedestrian crossings at the ASDA roundabout.

20 mph Zone A 20 mph zone has been successfully implemented in Putney Vale. Following a borough wide consultation, we expect it to be extended to other residential roads in Roehampton.
