Your ward councillor report

20mph speed limit Increasing road safety for motorists, pedestrians and cyclists is a priority, and in a move backed by your local ward councillors, the council is introducing a 20mph speed limit to the borough's quiet residential roads. This safety improvement will be implemented borough-wide next year.

Take the river bus A new passenger pier has opened at Plantation Wharf, providing a stopping point for the river bus on the RB6 route between Blackfriars and Putney. The river bus company recently introduced fast and comfortable new boats on this route offering passengers free wifi and great on-board facilities.

New college campus The Royal College of Art is to build a new campus in Battersea. It will cater for up to 1,500 postgraduate students and focus on entrepreneurship.

Super new school The brand new St John Bosco secondary school is going from strength to strength after its multi-

million pound modernisation and refurbishment. This co-educational school offers state-of-the -art teaching and learning facilities to young people from across Wandsworth.

Brighter bridges We are campaigning to have Battersea's bridges included in the Mayor's recently announced Illuminated River Project, which aims to light up inner London's bridges and enliven its riverside.

Estates football With the backing of your local ward councillors, young people have successfully campaigned for a new £30,000 astroturf football pitch to be provided on the Surrey Lane estate.

Summer scheme Hundreds of young people enjoyed great activities in Battersea Park as part of the local crime prevention panel's annual summer scheme. This excellent charity does great work every year offering exc iting activities during the long summer holiday and your ward councillors are proud to support its efforts.
