The closure of Wilna Road (Earlsfield Ward) Adolescent Resource Centre (ARC).

The proposal is being made in the context of the high costs and variable occupancy levels at Bridge House ARC and Wilna Road ARC. Alternative options are considered necessary to deliver improved alternative placement for young people and better value for money. This proposal reflects a number of changing factors including limited ability to match complex placement needs of Wandsworth's looked after young people.

BME young people are over-represented in the CLA population. A focussed group has been set up to consider this. There are currently 3 young people placed at Wilna Road. 1. Black British/Caribbean. 2. White British. 3. Asian British /Bangladeshi. Move on plans have been developed for all young people who will be moving on well before the proposed date of closure. The proposed plans are part of a reconfiguration of services which aims to prevent young people from entering care, to support young people in their families and where this is not possible provide tailored support for young people. Closure of Wilna Road will not mean that young people who were previously supported there are not able to access support. This is of particular importance as it is recognised that BME young people are over-represented amongst the CLA population in Wandsworth. 47% of CLA population is female. Gender There are currently 3 young people placed at Wilna Road. male. female. female. Move on plans have been developed for all young people who will be moving on well before the proposed date of closure. The proposed plans are part of a reconfiguration of services which aims to support young people in their families and where this is not possible provide tailored support for young people. Closure of Wilna Road will not mean that young people who were previously supported there are not able to access support. Disability Disability as a primary need code accounts for nearly 10% of CLA. Increasingly, young people entering residential care have mental health problems and this requires staff to have the skills necessary to support them. Many of the young people using the units have suffered multiple placement breakdowns. These young people often present challenging and self-destructive behaviour. The closure of Wilna will not mean that these young people are not able to access support rather budget will be allocated to purchase, where required, specialist placements with specialist support for these young people.
