Tennis talent A council supported tennis initiative at Putney Lawn Tennis Club saw 16 young players from Ark Putney Academy attending 10 weekly coaching sessions at the club.

20mph zone a success A 20mph zone introduced across West Putney and the Dover House Road area has been deemed a success by residents who wanted lower speed limits in their neighbourhoods.

Safety railings stay Following intensive lobbying by your local ward councillors, TfL has abandoned its plan to remove the guard railings near Sacred Heart School in Roehampton Lane.

Protecting Putney Park Lane To maintain the lane's tranquil nature and allow pedestrians to safely use and enjoy it, new signs have been erected warning motorists that they could face legal action if they cause damage by their driving or parking.

Window renewals Residents on the Ashburton and Roehampton estates are having their old windows replaced. The installations should be completed within the next 18 months.

Dover House play space Using a grant from the town hall's Big Society Fund, parents on the estate have established a natural play space on The Pleasance green, which is proving hugely popular. Plans are in hand to further extend the play opportunities this year.

Spring bulb planting The council and local people planted more than 400 spring-flowering bulbs in autumn 2012 to enhance the play space, leading to a great show of colour last spring.

Primary schools on a high All primary schools in West Putney are now rated Good or Outstanding by Ofsted. Greenmead and Paddock Primary maintained their previous Outstanding rating, Granard successfully attained a Good rating and Sacred Heart was found to be maintaining its already high standards.

Last order for street drinkers An Asbo type order covering the Ashburton estate since March 2012 has resulted in street drinking being virtually eliminated. Those affected were helped by a multi-agency taskforce with their problems and addictions.
