The council wants to know what you think about life in Roehampton and Putney Heath ward.

Whether it's services like recycling, street cleaning, parking, education and housing where the council has a direct responsibility - or other areas like policing, public transport and the NHS - we want to make sure that we understand your priorities for your community.

The meeting will be chaired by council cabinet member Jim Maddan. Your three ward councillors, Jeremy Ambache, Peter Carpenter and Sue McKinney will also be present along with leader of the opposition, Rex

Osborn and senior managers from the main council services.



Your ward councillor report

Roehampton Regeneration We are working with the Masterplanners to ensure that the plans for regeneration prioritise the needs and wishes of all existing Roehampton residents. We want to ensure that the benefits of regeneration are spread across the ward.

20 mph Zone We have backed a petition calling for a 20 mph speed limit on all residential roads in Roehampton. This would help make our roads safer for everyone. We expect this proposal to be consulted on shortly.

Double Glazing We campaigned for the double glazing recently installed in the blocks in Ibsley Gardens. We are supporting the residents of Fontley Way and Highcliffe Drive in their campaigns for double glazing in their blocks.

Lennox Estate We campaigned for the refurbishment of the communal areas currently being carried out in the tower blocks. We are supporting the residents petition for a Zebra crossing to make crossing Priory Lane between The Lennox and Woking Close safer.

Transport Improvements We campaigned successfully to increase the frequency of the 72 bus down Roehampton Lane. We are working with TfL to extend the K3 route from ASDA through the Alton Estate to Queen Mary's Hospital and Barnes Station. This would also give Alton residents a direct route to Kingston Hospital.

Putney Vale We campaigned for the environmental improvements currently being carried out in Putney Vale. We are supporting the residents petition for a Zebra crossing at the ASDA roundabout to make this busy crossing safer.

Roehampton Village We are working with the businesses on Roehampton High Street to improve the parking arrangements for their customers by introducing more short stay parking places.

Mosaic Jewish Primary School Work will soon start on converting Hartfield House on Roehampton Lane into a new two form entry Primary School. Half the places will be reserved for local children. The school plans to open in September 2015.
