Information to accompany form FH1 – For council leaseholders wishing to apply to buy their freehold from the council.

Wandsworth Council wishes to allow council leaseholders to buy their freehold, wherever this is possible. There are two ways in which council leaseholders can apply to buy their freehold. The first is under the council's "Voluntary Scheme" and the second is under the Government's "Statutory Scheme".

You should use form FH1 if you are a council leaseholder and wish to apply to buy the freehold of your building from the council, under the council's *Voluntary Scheme*.

The *Voluntary Scheme* is likely to be suitable if:

- 1. All of the flats in your building have been sold on long leases (i.e. greater than 21 years), and;
- 2. All of the leases have more than 80 years still to run, and;
- 3. There are no more than 12 flats in your building, and;
- 4. Your building contains only flats & common parts, and;
- 5. All of the leaseholders in your building wish to buy the freehold from the council

In certain other circumstances the council may still be able to let you buy your freehold under the *Voluntary Scheme*, but may first need to ask the Government for permission, which may or may not be given.

Before filling in FH1 you should ask the Home Ownership Team for advice on whether or not the **Voluntary Scheme** is likely to be suitable for you. The Home Ownership Team's contact details are on the last page of form FH1. In addition, you are entitled to obtain legal advise from a Solicitor or other suitably qualified person, who should also be able to advise you about the Statutory Scheme. You may wish to ask the Home Ownership Team for an example of a Statutory Scheme application form and a copy of the Government's booklet called "Residential Long Leaseholders", which also includes information about how to make a Statutory Scheme application to renew your lease.

What happens next?

When we receive your completed *Voluntary Scheme* application form FH1 we will acknowledge receipt of the application. We will then arrange for our valuer to visit your building to assess the value of the freehold. He will need access to all of the flats in the building to be able to do this.

If we are able to agree to your application, we will send you an "offer letter" setting out the sale price and other terms, which you can either accept or reject. If we cannot agree to your application, or you find our offer unacceptable, you may still be able to buy your freehold under the Statutory Scheme.
