# WANDSWORTH BOROUGH COUNCIL SACRE- MARCH 2020

#### **STANDARDS IN RELIGIOUS STUDIES EXAMINATIONS IN 2019**

#### Introduction

This paper summarises the Wandsworth and England results for 2019 Religious Studies GCSE and A Level examinations. It provides more detailed data for Wandsworth down to school level.

This is provided for information and discussion.

#### Summary of national data

Outcomes are still provisional to date (software to be updated with final data in April). Headline figures are as follows:

#### The key outcomes for Religious Education in England at KS4 in 2019

- There were 207,720entries for the full course in GCSE Religious Studies (RS), a significant increase from 2018 (162,230).
- There were 4,350 entries for the short course in GCSE RS, an increase from 2018 (2,490) but still well below that of previous years, for example 2017 (12,489).
- There were 212,070 entries for GCSE RS (combined short and full courses) compared with 2018 (164,720).
- While it is pleasing to see that the numbers have risen from the low point last year, it is interesting to note the comparison with 2015 when 338,138 students sat a GCSE in RS.

## Summary of Wandsworth data

- 1,052 students sat a Religious Studies (RS) examination in Wandsworth in 2019, similar to the numbers in 2018 (1,046).
- 804 students sat the GCSE full course, and 13 the GCSE short course. This was an increase in full course and short course numbers. This rise was also reflected nationally.
- As for last year, the number of students in the cohort has been included in the data, which shows the wide variation in the percentage of a cohort opting for RS. There was again a great divergence between schools in this: St Cecilia's and Graveney entered almost all their students, Chestnut Grove and St John Bosco around three quarters, and Ashcroft about half.
- The lowest proportion was at Ernest Bevin where it was only around 3% of the cohort.
- Ark Putney again entered no students as it is not offered as a GCSE option.
- Only Francis Barber PRU entered students for the short course.
- It is not surprising that church schools enter more pupils, as RS is entitled to a defined amount of curriculum time, 10% in Catholic schools. Research from Liverpool Hope University shows that nationally, most of those taking religious studies are at faith schools, stating that 95% of students at RC schools and 68% at CE schools took the subject, while only 30% of students at schools without a religious character did so.
- There were 130 entrants for AS level, down from 159 in 2018, and 105 entrants for A Level, up from 82 last year (82). There were 15,980 candidates for religious studies A level in England, again down from the previous school year and showing a continuously falling trend.
- As noted last year, Rudolf Eliott Lockhart, the chief executive of the Religious Education Council had expressed his concern of the
  dramatic fall in the numbers studying RS, attributing it to the "consequence of policy decisions such as the exclusion of religious studies
  from key performance indicators at GCSE, insufficient bursary provision to encourage people to train as RE teachers, and a lack of
  action to hold schools to account when they fail to teach RE".
- This was the second year since the change in the gradings for RS GCSE, from the old A\* G, to the 9 point scale, with 9 the highest outcome possible, and above the old A\* grade. 4 is considered a standard pass at GCSE and 5 a strong pass. Direct comparison cannot therefore be made with the results of 2017 and earlier.
- However, Wandsworth students performed better than the national averages, with an average points score of 5.7, compared with 5.2 for all schools nationally. The highest average points (6.5) were earned at Ernest Bevin (6 students) and 6.4 at Harris Battersea, (22 students and around a fifth of the cohort). Only St Cecilia's (4.8) and Southfields (3.7) were below the national average.
- St John Bosco has now been on a four year upward trajectory, at 83.8% 9 4 above the national average for the first time.
- Overall the indicator of grades 9 4 showed that Wandsworth was again above the national average 78.9% compared with 72.4% national, although slightly below the LA 2018 9-4 average of 82.6%
- At AS level, students performed very well at grades A E, with an average of 95.4%, compared with 87.6% nationally and for A B, 60.8% compared to 36% nationally. These Wandsworth results were further up from 2018.

- At A level, the percentage A\* B comparator, showed slight drops for both Wandsworth and the national average. Wandsworth was still higher however (51.4% compared with 50% nationally). At A\* E, Wandsworth suffered a bigger drop to 96.2% from 98.9% compared with 97.9% nationally (98 in 2018).
- Within the LA as ever, results varied widely from school to school. At A level for A\* B, Ashcroft was 100% (7 students) and Harris 80% (5) students). Chestnut Grove had 66.7%, a drop from last year (81.8%) but well above average, as was St Cecilia's at 64.7%. Burntwood, Ernest Bevin and Southfield were well below in the 20s, but this was an increase for Southfields from last year, when no students had achieved A\* to B.
