This note has been produced by Simon Cooper-Grundy.

On day one of the inquiry, an Objector to the application asked for clarification of the site notices erected by the Council in respect of the Art.12 application.

Photographs 1 to 4 show the site notices which were initially erected concerning the Council's art.12 application to carry out works on Tooting Bec Common. These notices were erected on 12th November 2020 at the four points shown on the plan attached to the note on consultation (CD 34). These were A3 notices. It came to my attention that one of these initial site notices had been erected the wrong way around (see photograph 2). This was corrected on 13 November 2020.

In order to provide additional information about the proposed works, these initial notices were replaced about one week after the erection of the initial notices, with the notices shown as photograph 5 below. These replacement A3 notices were erected in the same places as the initial notices. I do not have photographs of these replacement notices in situ.

Local engagement prior to the submission of the Art.12 application was also raised. Having reviewed my records, I can confirm that a meeting took place on 15th July 2020, at Balham Boxing Club, attended by representatives from; the Friends of Tooting Common, Tooting Common MAC, TFC Leisure Ltd, Balham Boxing Club, Enable and Wandsworth Council.





NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Wandsworth is applying to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Mfalis for consent under article 12 of the Greater London Parks and Open Spaces Order 1997 to carry out restricted works on Tooling Bec Common. The Pfanning Inspectorate will decide the application on behalf of the Secretary of State. The proposed works are to improve the former Youth Club and Triangle One O'Clock centre buildings by the construction of rear and side extension to the former Youth Chub, currently occupied by the Balann Amateur Bording Club, the installation of new roofing across the Former Youth Club and extensions, and the corridor Initing this with the former One O'Clock centre building, and the Installation of new external doors and disabled access ramps together with the intrallation of new artificial grass surfaced all weather sports pitches with associated fencing and filoodlights on the adjacent area currently laid out as a redgras surfaced as ports pitch.

The improved buildings will provide facilities for the Balham Amateur Boring Club, with changing and tollet facilities for users of the indoor and outdoor sports facilities tog.ommon. They will also provide facilities for the continued provision of stay and play providing year round opportunities for children from the age of 18 months for both indoor and outdoor play and offering parents the choice to Join organised activities or play with their children themselves. In total the facilities occupy an area of 5000 sqm. situated in the north west corner of the Triangle field

The external walls of the metal clad building and the associated extension will be finished in dark green (similar to the current finish) and brick built extension will be painted to match the existing structure. The proposed extension to the buildings increases the built footprint from current 399 sq.m. to 456 sqm, an increase of 57 sqm. (+ 14.3% approx.)

There is no increase in the area occupied by the outdoor sports pitches.

A temporary compound for the storage of construction materials will be located on the hard surfaced area to the west of, and opposite the development site.

Due to Government advice in respect of Coronavirus (COVID-19), a copy of the application will not be left in a public area for viewing.


