Application for a Home to School Travelcard

For pupils aged 11 – 15

These notes explain Wandsworth Council's Home to School Travel Assistance Policy. Please read them carefully before filling in your application form.

Free travel for children and young people

All children under 16 in full time education travel free on bus and tram services.

All school pupils aged 11-15 are required to carry a Zip Oyster Photocard to travel free on buses and trams. They must 'touch in' as they board a bus or at the tram stop before boarding a tram. If they do not they will be liable for a penalty fare. All 11-15 year olds who do not have a valid Zip Oyster Photocard will be charged the full adult fare until they get one.

Home to School Travelcards

Pupils aged under 16 who, in the judgement of the Director of Children's Services, have an unreasonable journey to school using bus or tram services, may be entitled to assistance with the cost of rail and/or underground travel to and from school.

To qualify for a free Travelcard for your child, you must meet *all four* of the following requirements:*

1 Residence:

You must live in the borough of Wandsworth.

2 Distance:

The distance from your home to the school, using the shortest walking route with street lighting as measured by the council's Geographical Information System, must be over 3 miles.

3 Journey:

Your child's journey can only reasonably be made by train or tube (i.e. bus or tram travel is impractical).

4 School:

Your child must be attending the 'nearest suitable school' to your home (Wandsworth Council will take account of a parent's preference for a faith school). Wandsworth Council will also provide a free Travelcard for a child from a low-income family (families entitled to free school meals or receiving the maximum level of Working Tax Credit) where either:

- The child aged between 11 and 16 years attends one of the three nearest maintained schools or academies between 2 miles and 6 miles from their home; or
- The child aged between 11 and 16 years attends the nearest maintained school or academy, for which the parent has applied on the grounds of their religion, between 2 miles and 15 miles from their home.

*Wandsworth Council has the discretion to provide financial assistance for home to school travel in cases where the Director of Children's Services agrees that there are exceptional circumstances.

Frequently asked questions

• How is the distance from home to school measured?

The Council uses its Geographical Information System to calculate the shortest walking route with street lighting. We use the same method for every application, so that everyone is treated fairly.

• What is the 'nearest suitable school'?

The 'nearest suitable school' means the nearest Community school, Foundation school and Academy, or the nearest Faith school. If your child has a place at a school of one of these types, and there is no school of that type nearer to your home, either inside or outside the borough of Wandsworth, you will qualify for a Travelcard. The decision will be based on whether a place was available at your nearest suitable school when you originally applied (or should have applied) for a school place.

• What if my child was refused a place at the 'nearest suitable school'?

If you applied to your 'nearest suitable school' and you were refused, you might still qualify for a Travelcard. You should state on your application form any schools which you applied for, but were refused a place. In order to qualify for a Travelcard you will need to have been refused a place at all of your 'nearest suitable schools' and you will be asked to provide a copy of the refusal letter(s). (If you ranked the school your child is attending more highly in your secondary transfer preferences than the 'nearest suitable school' you will not be eligible for assistance.)

• Are there any types of school that don't qualify?

We only award Travelcards for children attending state schools and academies. We do not award Travelcards for children attending private fee-paying schools.

• What if my child goes to school outside Wandsworth?

If your child attends a school outside Wandsworth, you may still qualify for a Travelcard if you meet all four qualifying requirements (see page 1).

• What if I have an older child at the same school?

If you have an older child who was awarded a Travelcard, it does not mean you will automatically get a pass for a younger child. Your younger child will have to meet all the requirements of the policy, as described above.

How to apply

Please complete the attached form in full and return it to Pupil Services, Wandsworth Children's Services, Town Hall Extension, Wandsworth high Street, London SW18 2PU, or scan and email the form to admissions@wandsworth.gov.uk We will advise you of the outcome of your application in writing.

If your application is approved, your child will need an 11-15 Zip Oyster Photocard in order to collect the Travelcard from his or her school. Your child must carry the 11-15 Zip Oyster Photocard at all times when using public transport. You must apply online. You will need to register on the website and supply a digital colour passport-style photograph of your child. You may also be asked to provide details from the applicant's machine readable passport. You can still apply online if you don't have these details.
