Get Out Get Active Roehampton!

From next year, local people of all ages will be able to take part in a range of sports and physical activities through an initiative called Get Out Get Active.

The idea is to establish regular exercise and sports in community venues across the Roehampton and Putney Heath area, including the Alton estate.

The scheme will be run by Enable Leisure and Culture, which has secured funding from Spirit of 2012 for three years, but with the aim of establishing community-run activity sessions that are financially sustainable beyond when the funding runs out.

Regenerate is a youth and community charity working with young people and their families in Roehampton. It was set up by residents living on the Alton estate to provide positive activities, improve health and wellbeing, and help young people develop a vision for their future. The following are activities run by Regenerate:

Ashburton youth club, Westleigh Avenue, SW15 6XD Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays, 6-8pm, for ages 11-19; pool or table tennis; football; cookery; music studio.

Juice bar youth club, 4 Portswood Place, SW15 4ED Tuesdays and Thursdays, 4–7pm, for ages 11-19; pool or table tennis; cookery; music studio.

Football, Roehampton Sport and Fitness Centre, Laverstoke Gardens Thursdays, 4.30-6pm, for ages 7-11.

One-to-one mentoring is available through the Get Focused programme to regular attendees of youth clubs, which helps foster personal development plans and support to achieve aspirations.

The Feel Good Bakery is a social enterprise founded by Regenerate that employs ex-offenders and young people exiting gangs or who have not been in education, employment or training. Our outstanding sandwiches are sold locally within the Roehampton community.
