## Regeneration: career opportunities

Jobs, training and apprenticeships for local people are top priorities for the council in the regeneration, and any development partner will provide these as a condition of being appointed.

Construction is only one aspect of the opportunities expected to be available, which can include security, site office administration, decorating and more.

The redevelopment of Nine Elms, in Battersea, is many times greater in size than what is proposed for Alton, but the council will use the same approach in requiring that developers provide local people with jobs and training as part of Alton's regeneration, through Work

Regulars enjoying a night of bingo

## Bingo and more at Alton Community Hall

It's not every community hall volunteer that would chase two purse-snatching thieves down the road.



Rene Coles, 72, saw a woman she knew to be heading to the weekly Petersfield Risebased bingo club step off a bus before being robbed, and made a split-second decision when she saw the two miscreants getting away.

The greatgrandmother-of-two said: "Two boys took her purse. Nobody on

the bus helped her! I ran after them shouting, but I couldn't catch them."

This incident led to closer ties with the local neighbourhood policing team, who now drop by the bingo club every once in a while to reassure its regulars that the police keep an eye on what's going on.

Thought to have been established in 1953, Alton Community Hall has been run by Rene on a voluntary basis for the past eight years, along with its treasurer, Alan Housden, who also operates the bingo numbers machine.

The facility hosts a range of bookings, including for boxing, majorette dancing, religious and prayer groups, wedding

receptions, and children's parties. A particular highlight is the annual Christmas party, which includes a buffet, raffle, and everyone receives a present.

Alan Housden calls the legendary 'Legs Eleven

Rene said: "It's like a family, we're all friendly, we all know each other, we worry about each other. Most of our family members have grown up together. That's why people love it."

Everyone from children and their parents to young people and pensioners come along, she adds, including a 90-year-old woman who climbs the club's three flights of stairs every week for the bingo. As part of the Alton regeneration, the club could be moving to new premises that would either have a lift provided, or be on the ground floor.

After getting married, Rene was pregnant when she first moved to the Alton estate in 1969 along with her

two-year-old daughter. She went on to work as an assistant youth leader; in a fish and chips shop on Roehampton High Street; and as a care assistant at Queen Mary Hospital, before taking on the management of the community club.

Rene said: "I've always done something in the village."

The bingo has been going on for as long as Rene can remember, back when it used to be run by Alan's mother and father, and then latterly her sister and a friend.

She said: "People say bingo is for if you're old, but it's not, we get all sorts coming along. We had two 22-year-olds in, and they said they wanted to see what bingo was like. They won, and were quite pleased."

Bingo takes place on Friday evenings, doors open 6.30pm, eyes down 7.30pm, at Alton Community Hall, 1 Petersfield Rise, Roehampton, SW15 4AE
