- "I like my home and would like to have it refurbished"







"Regeneration in area of Clapham Junction Station is long over due!"


"Obviously not happy with current crime rate and anti-social behaviour in the estate"













Station Piazza:

A new piazza with clear routes leading to the station entrance and spaces for public activity around cafes, facilities and shops

Public Realm:

These examples show how public realm improvments help to reduce clutter on pavements and provide easier crossings for pedestrians and cyclists

Activate tunnel crossing with local arts or media


