Lightbox Theatre	Capacity Building Grant	To increase our income capabilities and put our fundraising (and therein artistic) activities on a more stable footing. This will be achieved by receiving support from external expertise and training, increasing our fundraising capacity and implementing more diversified fundraising strategy (which includes the development of revenue streams from education and skills workshops).	£ 10,000.00
Furzedown Community Network	Furzedown Festival & Big Day Out	The proposed activity is the 16th annual Furzedown Festival, over two weeks, (including a Big Day Out) as well as locally organised events such as history talks, films, garden gigs, storytelling, church activities and our now annual Jazz on the Lawn. The funding will go towards funding the children's activities.	£ 1,000.00
Aspire 2 Inspire Dyslexia	Entrepreneurship & Employability support for people with Dyslexia and children support	To deliver 40 free support trainings to adult and young people with Dyslexia to support them through group work and through additional 40 one to one sessions, with the aim to help them overcome their employability obstacles due to Dyslexia.	£ 8,799.00
DP Health & Fitness Education	Fit4Work	The project will equip excluded and disadvantaged young adults with the confidence and qualifications to create careers and meet the demand for jobs in the fitness industry. Programmes combine accredited fitness qualifications with personal development work. Graduates then receive job search and skills development support.	£ 5,000.00
Battersea Choral Society	Battersea Youth Choir - "Building Bridges"	To include a new Battersea Youth Choir in a specialist concert celebrating Battersea's heritage. BCS is commissioning a new piece to be performed by BCS, the Battersea Power Station Community Choir and the newly formed BYC, all performing together, with a professional orchestra and soloists in the heart of Battersea.	£ 2,500.00
Broomwood Football Club	Hiring of Astro turf pitches during the winter	To fund the hiring of Astro turf pitches to allow us to play matches on Saturdays and train midweek/Saturday during the winter months when often the Wandsworth Common pitches are unusable due to the weather conditions.	£ 5,000.00
Magic Kids	Early Years Active	The project is aimed at young children (2-6 years olds) who have potential issues with obesity and unhealthy lifestyles, through using the attraction of football to improve their future health and well-being. The second element to this project is to engage with parents, to entice them into volunteering with the aim of providing them with football coach training resulting in a qualification (FA Level 1 & 2 Coaching) which can result in self-reliance to continue with the activity with their own and other children and even to possibly gaining employment in a related field.	£ 3,200.00
Putney ARTS Theatre - Group 64	The Writers Project	Through drama and writing workshops, a group of 6 with a Director and a professional playwright will work with two classes over the course of a term to write their own script. The class will then get the opportunity to perform the play on stage at Putney Arts Theatre.	£ 2,745.00
Sentalk	SEN Lego Social Group	To run 3 x 6 week long Lego Social Skills programme for parents/carers and their children with a formal diagnosis of Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder. The objective is to provide children with these specific social communication difficulties an opportunity to attend an extra-curriculum session outside of school, to develop social skills and strategies to self-regulate and modulate behaviours within a group setting. For some children diagnosed with ADHD, attending after school activities is too overwhelming, and the pressure of social expectations proves too difficult, meaning that enrichment opportunities are missed.	£ 4,235.00
Devas Club	Employability Project for young people aged 17-19 years to include Renovation of Café and Reception Area at Devas Youth Club.	Twenty NEET young people to acquire skills and support into employability by industry professionals. Renovation of café and reception area to provide a space where ongoing work with young people can take place.	£ 4,969.00
SignHealth	Young DeafHope - Deaf Domestic Abuse Service	Young DeafHope is an educational/preventative service for Deaf children teaching children about abuse, staying safe and breaking the cycle of violence. A deaf-led service in sign language, specialist workers will work with young deaf people in Wandsworth providing vital, accessible knowledge and supporting children if/when they disclose abuse.	£ 7,080.00
Tooting & Balham Sea Cadets	Cadets Camping equipment	To replace the camping equipment which is used by sea/marine cadets throughout the year. This primarily consists of sleeping bags and tents. The existing equipment is aging and will soon not be fit for purpose.	£ 1,349.88
Kambala Residents Association	Kambala Cares Project - Community Engagement events	To expand a pilot project that took place last year, where we took residents on a coach trip to Margate and Bath Christmas market. To run three coach trips for residents with the aim to tackle isolation in the community, promoting family time, and greater community cohesion. We had a range of different residents, from elderly, families and some children with special educational needs attending both trips. We received great feedback, and thus an increase in resident participation after these events.	£ 2,018.00
Floral Angels	Floral Angels	We are a Floral Charity recycling donated flowers and giving to those in need in the community. We also hold floral therapy workshops. We are run 100% by volunteers. We work out of New Covent Garden Flower Market. In February 2017 we will be without premises as the market moves to new premises and does not have room for us. We are seeking funding for rental costs for the first year in new premises.	£ 10,000.00
Action on Hearing Loss	Hearing Matters	The project aims to tackle social isolation for older residents in Wandsworth, who have undiagnosed hearing loss through hearing screening and referral to supporting services. Screening will take place in Care Homes and the general Wandsworth population. As a public health initiative, this project supports Wandsworth's 2014 JSNA to reduce social isolation amongst the elderly population.	£ 8,336.00
Baked Bean Company Charity	Runner Beans	To pilot a sports course for adults and young people with learning difficulties. The course will enable learners to develop and demonstrate a range of skills through various sports, fitness activities and studies. The course aims to improve learners' health, fitness, skills, understanding and enjoyment of sports.	£ 8,000.00
Disability Sports Coach	Community Sport Club - Wandsworth	Weekly community sports club for disabled people aged 11+ that has a positive impact on physical and mental wellbeing. The club enables people with a wide range of disabilities to be physically active in a supported environment with specially trained coaches and adapted equipment.	£ 4,555.00
Harmony Dance	Inclusive Intergenerational Dance Workshops	Inclusive dance workshops leading to a small performance for people with and without disabilities and the elderly. To break down social barriers through mixing participants of various walks of life in a week long programme of inclusive dance workshops.	£ 3,650.00
HomeStart Wandsworth	Bump to Baby project	We propose a pilot Bump to Baby project: an innovative early intervention programme, extending our unique one-to-one home visiting volunteer work to support families through pregnancy and postnatally. Support will focus on perinatal mental health, parent-infant attachment and infant development and wellbeing, and will foster a positive transition to parenthood.	£ 10,000.00
PCC of St Michael and All Angels with St Stephen	Open House: Social Club Gathering for the Elderly	Open House is a weekly drop-in social club for senior citizen's living in and around the Southfields estates which we are aiming to develop. We provide a regular programme of activities and events as well as home-made cakes and warm drinks. We also distribute relevant information about local services and encourage participant's involvement in additional activities.	£ 5,100.00
Wandsworth Sickle Cell Support Group	Be well in the community	The Support Group intends to enhance its range of services to reflect the needs of the service users, their families, parents and carers. These programmes will be successful in helping individuals and their families to secure self-directed management of their conditions, aspirations and life choices.	£ 1,000.00
