TMO amendments will be required under the RTRA 1984 to amend parking and single yellow line waiting restrictions to double yellow lines on Elmbourne Road and convert/introduce waiting and loading restrictions to no waiting 'At Any Time' on Bedford Hill at the junctions with Elmbourne and Hillbury Road including Dr Johnson Avenue (western kerb-line). A notice, under the Highways (Road Hump) Regulations 1996, will also be required to introduce raised tables on Elmbourne Road at the junctions with Streathbourne, Huron, Manville, Bushnell Road, raised speed tables outside property numbers 8 and 20 Elmbourne Road and one outside 17 Hillbury Road. A total of fifteen existing round top humps will be removed. **London Borough of Lewisham Framework Contract** 29.10.2019 for Highway and Transport Design Services. To approve the signing of a Non-Disclosure Agreement in relation to the framework contract for 'Highway and Transport Design Services' with the London Borough of

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Lewisham, and (subject to being satisfied that the rates in the contract are competitive) sign the access agreement to the framework to allow the direct appointment of Waterman Group as Principal Designer and key support on the Wandsworth Bridge refurbishment project.
