1	CARAS	Gardens of respite, wildness and wellness	We intend to recruit and support 50 refugee women to become active members of our local community garden. For one year, CARAS will bring 5-10 women to the garden each week to take part in the seasonal maintenance and enjoyment of the garden. By the end of the year we intend for women who wish to continue using and contributing to the garden to continue doing so autonomously. To this end women's participation in the organisation of the project will be encouraged and supported. Visits will include 10 women at a time, reaching 50 over a year. The women will be supported to take up leadership opportunities at each major event of the season, including the Summer Open Day, Halloween, and Spring Seed Swap. At a key moment in each season, there will be a planned point of reflection: how do people feel about the work they have been doing, their local connection, and themselves? 2	Little Village	Roehampton Satellite	This project seeks to create a satellite Little Village service within the Eastwood Children's Centre. In doing so, we will tackle poverty, disadvantage and isolation by: making it easy for Roehampton based families to get the essential kit they need for children under 5 by accessing our service closer to home; providing volunteering opportunities on their doorstep, allowing them to reduce isolation and build employability skills. We will run two sessions per week, hosted in the Eastwood Children's Centre. The service at Eastwood will be open 39 weeks a year in line with Wandsworth school terms. We will recruit a Site Manager to lead the Roehampton team. This project will provide early intervention and preventative work for some of the most vulnerable families in the Roehampton area, particularly children whose parents may be suffering mental health problems, and who may be dealing with multiple challenges, negatively impacting their ability to provide a stable and safe home for their children We are keen to ensure that our students are equipped with everyday living skills. Preparing healthy, nutritious meals at home is important for everyone and complies with a number of our Theory of Change outcomes: improved practical skills: increased well-being: improved physical health; increased independence. 3	Share Community	Healthy Cookery Classes	We plan to work with Be Enriched's Cooksforce project to deliver a series of healthy cookery workshops to adults with a learning disability in Wandsworth. Be Enriched are a local charity that deliver a number of community food-related projects in Wandsworth. Their Cooksforce project describes their goal as 'to develop the basic cooking skills of people to enable them to make fresh, delicious, wholesome meals from scratch, at home and on a budget. The course also aims to get people thinking creatively about saving food from being wasted and will use surplus food from local retailers in the practical sessions.'  Students will travel to the kitchen location where they each will be provided with a hob, access to an oven and all the ingredients and equipment to make a simple, healthy meal which they will enjoy eating together at the end of the session. The culmination of the weekly activities will firstly be an informal performance within the group, followed by a public performance by the participant at an appropriate community festival. Our project will improve the health and wellbeing of a group of older residents —with priority given to those who are isolated and/or on low income. The project will be aimed at both men and women (as the sports chosen are excellent at accommodating people of all abilities and genders) and it is very likely that 60% + of the participants will be from BAME backgrounds. The specific outcomes will include: Reducing older people's isolation, improving their physical health, improving their mental health (through having wider social networks, learning new skills and increasing self-confidence) and reducing the likelihood of accidents and falls through participants having better physical coordination. We currently have a waiting list for our current projects we cannot add more people as numbers are constrained by the activity and facilities. 16	Regenerate	Get Leading	Get Leading is a leadership development programme for young adults aged 18-30 yrs. from Wandsworth who may be unemployed, at risk of social exclusion, at risk of crime, or affected by gang culture. We are planning to expand and update the existing Get Leading activity to increase the total number of beneficiaries from 14 to 20 per annum. We are also planning to improve the programme and its ability to work towards our outcomes by delivering a residential leadership development weekend where we can deliver the programme curriculum in more depth and to a higher standard. Get Leading provides monthly workshops developing leadership and enterprise skills and improving social-emotional wellbeing. The vision for Get Leading is to support and develop the next generation of community leaders to initiate enterprise and community initiatives to create socially and economically thriving communities For those who desire to complete an accredited course, a First Aid course will be open to 8 beneficiaries and a Personal Coaching course for 5 beneficiaries.
