

MORE GREEN FLAGS THAN EVER BEFORE

- The Green Flag Award is an international mark of quality for well-managed parks and green spaces all over the world
- This year, we have been awarded three new green flags bringing our total to five
- Green flags have been awarded to Battersea Park, Wandsworth Park, Wandsworth Common, King George's Park and Tooting Common



TREE PLANTING

We currently maintain approximately 60,000 trees, all situated on public land, streets, parks and housing sites

We will be spending £100,000 on new trees over the next two years
