## THE NHS IS OPEN FOR BUSINESS

From December 1st, book a time slot at Queen Mary's to get urgent medical help

In March this year the Urgent Treatment Centre (UTC) at Queen Mary's Hospital was closed so that patients and staff would be as safe as possible during the Covid-19 pandemic. Since then, the NHS in Wandsworth has been working with local people, GPs, and hospitals to determine what we could do over the coming winter to meet people's needs, while keeping the risk of Covid-19 very low.


We are pleased to announce that a new temporary service called the Enhanced Primary Care Hub is opening at Queen Mary's Hospital on Tuesday 1st December and will run until April 2021. The service will:

- Include treatment for wounds, minor injuries, and GP appointments.
- Be by appointment only (via NHS 111 or their GP).
- Be for all ages.
- Not see walk-in patients and those with Covid-19 symptoms (please continue to dial 119, 111, or 999, to get medical help).

# PLANNING APPLICATION UPDATE



A once in a generation masterplan to regenerate part of Wandsworth's iconic Alton estate was approved by Wandsworth Borough Council's Planning Applications Committee on 22nd October. The final decision on the scheme will now rest with the Mayor of London.

The transformational mixed-use regeneration will deliver more than 1,100 new homes including 261 council homes – an increase of 103 Council homes. The development will be phased to ensure residents are able to move straight into their new homes on the estate.

The proposals will also deliver new community facilities including a new library, youth centre, community hall, GPs surgery, nursery and children's centre together with new shops and business spaces.

Cllr Ravi Govindia, Leader of the Council, said: "Wandsworth Council is absolutely committed to making sure the regeneration of the Alton goes ahead and this is a significant milestone for what is an important scheme that will improve the lives of the residents of this estate, providing them with better homes and a better environment to live in."

#### **Next Steps**

**Planning**: The plans for the regeneration have been approved by the Local Planning Authority, however the plans will also need to be approved by the Mayor of London. Officers from both the Local Planning Authority and the Regeneration Team have met with officers from the Mayor's team to discuss the plans and hope to receive a positive decision from the Mayor at the earliest possible opportunity.

**Procurement**: The Council took ownership of the planning application for the regeneration in September when the Council's development partner (Redrow Homes) withdrew from the scheme following a decision to focus on regional developments. The Council has reviewed the different options for delivering the regeneration and has approved a plan to recruit a new development partner. The procurement process is expected to commence in early 2021.

**Community Engagement:** A Community Engagement Strategy has been approved which sets out the Regeneration Team's commitments, objectives and proposed approaches to engaging with the Alton community as the scheme moves from the planning to delivery stage. A detailed engagement action plan will be further developed in collaboration with the community.

Work has almost concluded at 5 Portswood Place to convert the vacant shop unit into a temporary wood-work studio for Roehampton Shed, which will give them more space to recommence their sessions safely and more quickly following lockdown.

It is intended that the Shed Team will collaborate with other locals of all ages on projects to enhance outdoor spaces on the estate and connect residents with nature, including the building of planters and hedgehog homes.

### WITLEY POINT MULTI USE GAMES AREA (MUGA) OPENING





The Mayor of Wandsworth, Cllr Jane Cooper, has opened a £250,000 refurbishment of a MUGA as part of the Alton regeneration. Children from Heathmere School were invited to a socially distanced opening event featuring mural painting, daffodil planting and the construction of a bug hotel to encourage wildlife.

Cabinet Member for Housing and Deputy Leader, Cllr Kim Caddy, said:

"I'm excited and pleased the games area has opened as it is a key part of our plans for the regeneration of the Alton Estate. The regeneration will deliver new Council homes but this demonstrates regeneration is about more than just housing."

### INTRODUCING LITTLE VILLAGE BY HELEN SPEEDY

#### Little Village is like a foodbank, but for clothes, toys and equipment for young children

Little Village is like a foodbank, but for clothes, toys and equipment for babies and children up to the age of 5. We're a movement of parents committed to alleviating material poverty in London and our mission is to build small, warm communities of families who support one another when times are tough. Our vision is that no child in the capital is without the essential things they need to thrive and that every parent can play a part in achieving that.

During Covid-19 we have been unable to carry on meeting families in person, so we have launched a "Virtual Village" to continue delivering hygiene essentials and emergency clothing bundles to families across the capital. Little Village is on track to support 6,000 children across London this year which is more than double the number we supported last year. We have been working with Eastwood Children's Centre to distribute nappies and toiletries to families with children up to 5 years old, along with the Roehampton Community Boxes supplied by Rackets Cubed in partnership with Heathmere School and Regenerate.

Following the lockdown, we will be looking for volunteers for sorting, packing and dispatching sessions every Monday and Tuesday during term time between 10am and 1pm. All our volunteering sessions are run in line with government coronavirus guidelines and provide a flexible, fulfilling way of supporting other families who are struggling during this very difficult time.

## THE FIRST ALTON CHRISTMAS TREE



The Alton Regeneration Team in collaboration with the Economic Development Office are excited to announce that a 20ft evergreen conifer has been installed in Roehampton for the first time this Christmas. The tree is locally sourced and will be situated at the junction between Danebury Avenue and Holyborne Avenue for approximately five weeks. In January the tree will be recycled by Roehampton Shed for use in woodwork projects with the local community.

The tree has been adorned with white lights which were switched on by The Mayor of Wandsworth, Cllr Jane Cooper, and local resident and Founder of Estate Art, Lynne Capocciama. A film of the switch on will be available to view on the Council's website.

The Regeneration Team has also been hosting virtual craft sessions with local schools and youth groups to create paper chain decorations. Each strip has been decorated to depict a mood, a feeling, an experience or a hope. Each chain will measure just over two metres in length to represent the recommended social distance, and will symbolise unity and connecting with others. The decorations will be displayed in local shops and community hubs.

### **CITIZENS ADVICE UPDATE**

EU citizens need to secure their rights to live in the UK



If you or anyone in your family are a European citizen, you need to take action to secure your right to live, work, study and to receive benefits and services in the UK after Brexit. Citizens Advice Wandsworth can help you apply to the EU Settlement Scheme (settled and pre-settled status).

The EU Settlement Scheme (settled and pre-settled status) is free and open to EU citizens and their non-EU family members. To make a successful application you need to prove your identity, prove that you live in the UK and declare any criminal convictions. For more information please visit gov.uk/eu-settled-status.

You should apply before 31 December 2020 as this is when your rights could change. You need to apply even if you have a Permanent Residence card, as your residence card will not be valid after 31 December 2020. You are also advised to apply if you have Indefinite Leave to Remain as you will obtain a more secure status.

Citizens Advice Wandsworth works in partnership with Wandsworth Borough Council to offer information and advice about Brexit and related issues to EU citizens and their non-EU family members living or working in Wandsworth.

### WHITE RIBBON CAMPAIGN: STAND UP AND SPEAK OUT AGAINST DOMESTIC VIOLENCE BY VICKY PIGOTT



Every year thousands of people stand up, speak out and say no to violence against women

With the coronavirus pandemic, this year's White Ribbon Campaign has become even more important than ever with a significant increase in violence, harassment and abuse towards women. The White Ribbon pledge is: "Never commit, excuse, or remain silent about male violence against women and airls."

Roehampton has one of the highest incidences of domestic abuse in the borough of Wandsworth, with rates increasing during the pandemic and during lockdown. Locally, groups such as Regenerate and Citizens Advice Wandsworth have been supporting this campaign and White Ribbon posters and National Helpline cards have also been shared throughout Roehampton.

At the Ashburton Youth Club, Regenerate has been teaching young people about White Ribbon day and the importance of the campaign. Andy Smith, CEO of Regenerate, says: "We must not be afraid to say no to violence against girls and women".

Wandsworth Council has also held 2 free learning events for local leaders across the borough with the aim to increase knowledge and understanding of domestic abuse issues and empower people to contact support organisations when they or someone they know is experiencing domestic abuse.
