Any such application must be made promptly, not later than 3 months after the date on which the SPD was adopted (23 July 2025).

3.5	<p>To insert following text:</p> <p><i>3.5 Batteries are a fire risk and it is essential that batteries are disposed of correctly, in line with instructions and the appliance requirements:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><i>• Non-domestic producers of waste are required to separate batteries from other hazardous waste and non-hazardous waste.</i></li> <li><i>• Developers/managing agents of large residential developments should encourage residents to dispose of batteries responsibly, through signage in recycling and waste storage areas.</i></li> <li><i>• Residents can dispose of batteries at recycling points in shops, supermarkets and at the Council's waste and recycling centres.</i></li> </ul>
