



NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR THE REVIEW OF A PREMISES LICENCE

Notice is given that application has been made to the Licensing Authority for a review of the premises licence in respect of the following premises:

Stonehenge Food & Wine (Formerly Sadaf Express), 7 Lower Richmond Road, London, SW15 1EJ

The application for review has been made on the following grounds:

(GROUNDS FOR REVIEW)

Between April and June 2026, Stonehenge Food & Wine (formerly Sadaf Express) failed two Trading Standards test purchases, resulting in alcohol being sold to underage volunteers on 17/04/2026 and 24/06/2026. Licensing inspections on 22/04/2026 and 30/06/2026 found repeated failures relating to CCTV, staff training, incident logs and the sale of prohibited high-strength single cans, with formal warnings issued on both occasions. The evidence demonstrates persistent non-compliance and repeated failures to promote the licensing objectives, particularly the protection of children from harm and the prevention of crime and disorder.
