As part of Wandsworth Council's Black History 365, Wandsworth-based artist Fée Uhssi will be hosting The African Fashion & Textiles Experience. Beginning in September 2023, it will be a series of 6 monthly educational and interactive creative workshops exploring African art and textile history.

We eagerly anticipate providing new housing options for residents in spring 2024. The challenges of 2023, including the increasing cost of living, have been difficult for everyone. We remain hopeful that the new year will bring new fortune and abundant opportunities for all.

WINSTANLEY AND YORK ROAD RESIDENTS SHOW FLAT - COMPETITION WINNER SEES THEIR DESIGN COME TO LIFE

As part of the council's commitment to engage effectively with and respond to our residents, interviews and focus groups have been held with residents over the past couple of years. The residents, who have moved into new council homes at Mitchell House, Sphere Walk and Gideon Road have assisted the team to try to improve the moves process for future building completions.

One of the proposals put forward was to provide a 'show home' to allow future residents to view a typical new flat.

The Regeneration team working with HTA Design, the architects for the Winstanley and York Road regeneration, launched a design competition for young people to design and deliver a show flat in a void property in Mitchell House for residents who were to move into new homes in the scheme, the next being those residents who will move into Block 5, the first block on the main site of the regeneration scheme.

The competition was structured as a live project enabling the participants to gain real world experience in designing and pitching their interior design proposals for the flat. The participants had to respond to the set brief and produce a design based on their ideas to a restricted budget.



The budget represents the total compensation figure and the advanced payment made to residents for their move, as part of the Regeneration scheme commitments.

The competition winner, Ricky Le, has been presented with the chance to see his design brought to life in the show flat. 126 families who will be moving in to Block 5 will meet with the Council in the show flat to see what their new home will be like once completed on site early next year.

Ricky and runner up Norah Dankwah have both received prize money and both been offered work experience placements at HTA.

Ricky Le, Winstanley Estate Resident and Competition Winner, said:

"The reason I entered the competition was because it caught my interest due to its creative nature and my interest in this line of work. I thought it could be a great opportunity to meet amazing people in this field and could help me get closer to going into interior design and decor.

"Through this competition I've learnt directly how to manage my time and develop a cost plan, as well as designing the space in the apartment."

The secure tenants and leaseholders moving to Block 5 will receive their offers in the new year and then the opportunity to view the show home will be available to everyone.









TIME CAPSULE

The Regeneration team collaborated closely with the local residents, groups and stakeholders within the community for a duration of 8 months to execute the time capsule project. During this time, groups actively contributed their own ideas and created a diverse collection of captivating and significant memorabilia. The Time capsule was buried in the gardens of Arthur Newton House, as this area will form part of the new central park in York Gardens. Once the development is complete, circa 2036, the capsule will be dug up for reminiscing and reflection.

SAFE SPACE WANDSWORTH

'Safe Space Wandsworth' is based outside Clapham Junction Rail Station every Friday night from 9pm-1pm to provide a safe space for women and girls or anyone who is feeling vulnerable.

The Met Police and British Tranpsort Police are supported by Wandsworth Council to run the Safe Space, where residents can seek support and advice related to Domestic Abuse and Violence Against Women and Girls (VAWG) or use the Safe Space to wait safely for onward transport. You can find the Safe Space gazebo outside the St John's Hill exit of Clapham Junction station, in front of Starbucks, every Friday night.
