BLOCK 5 NEARS COMPLETION

The Regeneration team is eagerly awaiting the arrival of Summer 2024 when Block 5 will complete. This is a milestone for the project, as it will be the very first Block to be constructed on-site and will provide new homes for families currently residing in Scholey House, Kiloh Court, Jackson House and Arthur Newton House.

The development will include 126 new social homes, including 16 wheelchairaccessible units and 8 adapted flats with level access showers to meet specific residents' needs.

Additionally, there will be a new commercial unit on the ground floor, expected to be a small supermarket, and a private communal courtyard with natural play areas for residents.

COMMUNITY-LED PLANNING CHANGES FOR CLAPHAM JUNCTION

Wandsworth Council is starting work to produce a masterplan for Clapham Junction station and the surrounding area. We're working with other organisations invested in the area including Network Rail, Transport for London, the GLA and the ShopStop shopping centre which connects St John's Hill to the station entrance.

We know that residents and organisations have already spoken to the council about issues in the Clapham Junction station area and that a community-led plan has been produced, so we will build on this work wherever we can.

WHAT'S HAPPENING

Network Rail needs to upgrade Clapham Junction station to make sure it continues to run efficiently and can support high passenger numbers. Alongside this we want to ensure any wider development delivers the best outcome for the local area. Clapham Junction is one of Wandsworth's busiest town centres with thousands of people passing through the railway station and coming here to live, work, visit and shop every day.



WHAT WE WANT TO DO

We are looking at ways to:

- Improve connections and walking routes, such as Falcon Road bridge,
- strengthen the area identity and town centre links,
- improve wayfinding and the public realm,
- deliver genuinely affordable housing, particularly social rented housing.
- The council is also considering options for extending the Northern Line to Clapham Junction.
- A specialist team led by Weston Williamson and Partners (WW+P) are working with us to listen and talk to the local community about the project during 2024 and 2025.

KLS is 100 years old! The centenary celebrations began with a visit from HRH The **Duchess of Edinburgh where** she engaged with members, volunteers and staff to learn about our vital work in the community.

Art is at the centre of our big birthday year: KLS is brightened by the new community-led mural, House of Love' by artist Adalberto Lonardi. The permanent artwork is open to the public from Monday to Friday, 9 am-5 pm and all visitors are welcome. The Youth Bus is out and about across the borough six days a week, Monday's 3pm-7pm at York Gardens and Thursday 3pm-7pm at Yvonne Car Centre, Thessaly Road.

This is an exciting development allowing Youth Workers to see young people in their own area.

The bus offers a youth work programme with activities that include gaming, arts and crafts, and music. The aim is to build healthy relationships and signpost children to other appropriate services. The bus also has other services on board, including substance misuse workers and presentations on young people's

rights in Stop and Search.

This is a great initiative and it is sure to be a valuable resource for young people in the borough. The bus will provide a



safe and welcoming space for young people to socialise, learn, and get help and advice.

MAKES NIGHTS OUT SAFER: SAFE SPACE LAUNCHED IN CLAPHAM JUNCTION

We have worked with our partners to launch the Safe Space Wandsworth initiative in Clapham Junction to provide a safe space for women and girls, or anyone who is feeling vulnerable. It is designed to help people feel more at ease when enjoying the night-time economy. Members of the public can seek support and advice for all forms of VAWG, use the gazebo to wait safely for onward transport or have a chat with officers and volunteers.



SLEEPING ROUGH OR STREET HOMELESSNESS

There are a number of agencies who can help if you have no option other than being on the street or sleeping rough. You may be able to find a place in a night shelter, hostel, bed and breakfast or refuge.

If you are looking for a bed for the night or want to report seeing a person sleeping rough contact:

These services aim to secure immediate accommodation for people sleeping on the street. If you have referred someone, the team will try to connect them with the appropriate services.

The initiative is a joint venture between our Community Safety Service and Partnership, the Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) in Wandsworth, and the British Transport Police.

Where and when to find the Safe Space

The Safe Space runs every Friday night from 8 to 11pm. It is located within one of the borough's busiest areas at night, outside the St John's Hill exit of Clapham Junction Rail Station.

SAFEGUARDING OUR YOUTH AT **CLAPHAM JUNCTION STATION**

Clapham Junction station, a bustling hub for many, also presents potential vulnerability for some of its younger users. Recognising this, **British Transport Police, the Metropolitan** Police, Wandsworth Council officers, and specialist charities Railway Children & Catch22 collaborated on a focused operation on Jan 17th.

This multi-agency endeavour saw officers proactively patrolling the station, engaging with young people to build trust and rapport, and working alongside experts to identify potential risks. Together, they conducted a comprehensive walkabout of the station, fostering a holistic understanding of the challenges faced by vulnerable youth and paving the way for targeted interventions in the future. This collaborative effort underscores our ongoing commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all who use Clapham Junction station.

The community plays a vital role in maintaining a safe station environment and we encourage residents to report any suspicious activity:

- By calling 101 or texting British Transport Police on 61016 for non-emergencies.
- Reporting online www.met.police.uk
- In person to the police or station staff
- By calling 999 only in an emergency

We are committed to ongoing collaboration and community engagement. Watch this space for upcoming events and initiatives aimed at addressing concerns and involving residents in safeguarding efforts.

A Voter Authority Certificate?

You can apply for a free Voter Authority Certificate, which is a document that contains your name and photograph. Apply at: gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate

Can I use out of date documents?

You can use expired ID if the photograph looks like you. if not, or you are not sure, apply for a Voter Authority Certificate.

I have changed my name. Can I use documents with my old name?

The name on your ID should match your name on the electoral register. Alternatively, you can take a document with you that shows you have changed your name (such as a marriage certificate).

Can I take a copy rather than the original?

Only original documents will be accepted – not photocopies or digital versions.

What if I vote by post?

You do not need photo ID to vote by post.

MEGA SKIP DAY

comes to the Kambala on Saturday 30th March.

Mega skip days are an opportunity for people to dispose of bulky items for free. Large skips are placed in neighbourhoods around the borough for all local residents to use. The council is now running 18 Mega Skip Days a year after figures showed they led to an 11% decrease in fly-tipping.

Wandsworth residents, (ID with evidence of address may be required!) can take up to six items along with them to the mega skip for free, including some electrical equipment and household items like mattresses and sofas.
