It offers consistent community-based activities and integrated casework to support wellbeing and connection. Weekly coffee afternoons, women's yoga, and sports sessions create safe, welcoming spaces that reduce isolation and help participants rebuild confidence and belonging. The project is open to all language levels and culminates in a co-designed Welcome Day in March 2026, plus youth-led social media content sharing facts about seeking asylum. <b>Fairbeats Music</b>	Fairbeats: Making music at Love to Learn	Fairbeats will run a year-long free music programme for 30–40 sanctuary-seeking children and young people with Love to Learn at KLS. Juniors access weekly creative sessions, while older participants join youth-led half-term projects. <b>Happy Homes Community</b>	Sanctuary Space	Supports sanctuary seekers in Wandsworth with English and digital classes, arts, sports, cultural trips, and community events. It tackles isolation and trauma through holistic wellbeing activities and builds integration through orientation, signposting, and volunteering, while strengthening organisational capacity through volunteers and local partnerships. <b>Katherine Low Settlement</b>	Community Learning Programme: English for Sanctuary Seekers	Informal, practical English learning for sanctuary seekers through conversational sessions and social activities like “walk and talk.” Led by trained volunteers with a free crèche, it engages those excluded by formal ESOL. <b>PCC St Michael's with St Stephen's</b>	Ukrainian Social Supper	The Ukrainian Social Supper project offers monthly free meals, social activities, and practical support for Ukrainian sanctuary seekers in Wandsworth. Serving around 30 guests each month, it reduces isolation, builds community, and supports wellbeing through shared meals, cultural activities, guidance, and friendships, providing stability for those rebuilding their lives. <b>Power to Connect</b>	Power 2 Connect: Supporting Refugee and Asylum Seeker Integration through Technology	The project will provide refurbished devices, data packages, and digital skills support to sanctuary seekers facing digital exclusion. Power 2 Connect will distribute 150 devices and 50 SIMs, plus training and drop-ins, enabling access to essential services, reducing isolation, and helping refugees, asylum seekers, NRPF families, and unaccompanied minors build independence. Engaging 60–80 participants, it reduces isolation, builds confidence, and supports mental health, culminating in a community celebration and cultural events that strengthen belonging and cohesion for local families. Insights from women and healthcare staff will inform a report and zine. The project promotes wellbeing, empowerment, and integration while providing evidence to improve services and reduce health inequalities.
